- Who was in charge of the vineyards? What do vineyards do? For what?
- Who was in charge of the olives? For what were they used?
- Who was in charge of the cattle? The camels? The donkeys? The flocks?
- To whom did all this property belong?

Verses 32-34

- What was Jonathan’s job?
- Who was he to David?

1 Chronicles 28

Verses 1-8

- According to verse 2, what had David intended on doing?
- Why would God not allow him to do so?
- Who had God chosen to sit on the throne after David?
- What would he build?

Verses 9-10

- Can you picture this. David now turns to speak to his son, Solomon. What does he implore him to do?
- I love this passage. It's so beautiful. David's charge to Solomon.

Verses 11-19

- Where did David get his building plans?

Verses 20-21

- What words from Joshua do you read here?

Verses 1-5

- To whom did David speak these words?

Verses 6-9

- Did these men have to be persuaded to carry out this work?
- To whom did they offer their time and talents? To David?

Verses 10-13

Verses 14-19

- Observe David's prayer.

- What was Solomon's reign like?

- Summarize the reign of David. Over whom did he reign? For how long? From where?

- What happens in this passage?
- Where are the acts of King David written?
